CASARA CLO PRESENTED WITH GORDON R. McGREGOR MEMORIAL TROPHY

Our very own Capt. Rod Lanning was presented with the prestigious Gordon R. McGregor Memorial Trophy, in recognition for his outstanding and meritorious achievements in the field of air transportation. The award was presented to Capt. Lanning by the Air Force Association of Canada (AFAC) on 11 October 2003, in Regina, Saskatchewan.

"I was totally surprised and shocked," said Capt. Lanning. "It's nice to get a little recognition for the long hours I've spent away from home. I've been around the world and visited over 135 countries, some of them over 150 times each."

Capt. Lanning is recognized as a high-time flyer, a term used for pilots who have a high number of flying hours in the Air Force. Capt. Lanning managed to log in excess of 13,000 hours of flying time in his military career. He flew the de Havilland Chipmunk, the CT-114 Tutor, the Beechcraft 18 Expeditor, the Douglas CC-129 Dakota, the CT-133 Silver Star and the CC-130 Hercules aircraft.

Capt. Lanning started his career with Air Force in 1967. He retired in 2002, and after a few short months transferred to the Reserve Force to be the 435 Squadron Liaison Officer for the Civil Air Search and Rescue Association (CASARA). His responsibilities include planning, co-ordinating and conducting CASARA zone evaluations, and monitoring standardization and proficiency of CASARA across 23 zones in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and the Northwest Territories.
